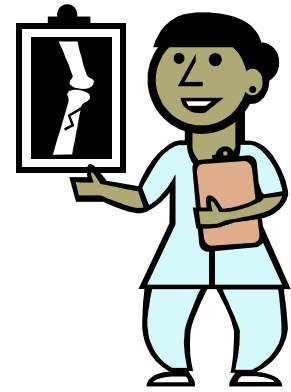

Is this info valuable?

- Who's writing it and why?
- Compare
 - Check the info against something else
- Corroborate
 - Check enough sources to get the whole story
 - Confirm, verify
- Context
 - Does the context of the website affect the information?
